Graded Agency:

The U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) is pleased to have achieved an "A" rating in the FY 2018 Scorecard. DOT continues committed to maximizing participation of small business concerns, including small disadvantaged businesses (SDB), women-owned small businesses (WOSB), service-disabled veteranowned small businesses (SDVOSB), and HUBZone firms in the delivery of its mission. FY2018 was a transition year for the Department as changes to the Small Business Goaling Methodology were implemented by the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) in accordance with the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) of 2013. The NDAA directed the SBA to establish goals in a manner that does not exclude contracts based on whether or not the contract is subject to Federal Acquisition Regulations. Accordingly, the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) was included for the first time in the DOT small business goals. This inclusion made a significant impact to DOT overall goal achievement as FAA contracts comprised close to 70% of all DOT contract dollars awarded in FY2018. DOT recognizes that there is more work to be done and remains committed to continually focusing our acquisition workforce on changes in acquisition policies and regulations that impact small business utilization and programs, and increase in outreach activities. We are excited to receive an "A" for FY2018 and, we will continue to identify areas to provide small business concerns maximum practicable opportunities in DOT acquisitions.
